Budget Progression to 0%

- ★ Original Budget Requests to Superintendent Resulted in an 8.12% Increase - Initial Reductions in Staff, Expenses in All Programs and All Departments
- ★ Superintendent's Proposed Budget to BOE Began with 2.34% Budget Further Staff Reductions, Departmental and School Level Decreases were Made
- **★** BOE Unanimously Approved a 0.0% budget

Elimination of Positions

- **★** 1.0 FTE Kindergarten
- ★ 1.0 FTE Grade 1
- **★** 1.0 FTE Grade 3
- ★ 1.0 FTE Grade 4
- **★** 1.0 FTE Secondary Teacher
- ★ 1.0 FTE Special Education Teacher
- **★** 1.0 FTE Custodian
- **★** 1.0 FTE Library Media Assistant

Departmental Reductions

- ★ Reduction of Anticipated Insurance Premium Increase from 15% to 13%
- ★ Special Education by 10%
- ★ Technology by 10%
- **★** PE/Athletics by 10%
- ★ Building Budgets by 10%
- ★ Custodial Equipment Purchase Removed

- **★** Medical Insurance Renewal Rate at 15%
