A motion was made by Jim Tripp, seconded by Meg Scata to introduce the Resolution entitled "FEDERAL AND STATE GRANTS – JOBS POND" and to wave the reading of the following resolution.

SPECIAL TOWN MEETING RESOLUTION

Town of Portland, Connecticut

June 18, 2024

FEDERAL AND STATE GRANTS - JOBS POND

WHEREAS, the Town of Portland has insufficient funding or other resources available to provide adequate relief from applicable hazards and have thereby requested Federal assistance from the Natural Resources Conservation Services ("NRCS") under the provisions of section 216 of the Flood Control Act of 1950, Public Law 81-516 or section 403 of the Agricultural Credit Act of 1978, Public Law 95-334, to restore damages sustained in Middlesex County by ongoing excessive rainwater flooding properties along Jobs Pond, specifically Jobs Gate 1, Jobs Gate 2 and Gate 3 on April 4, 2024; and

WHEREAS, this work is needed to safeguard lives and property from an imminent hazard of flooding basements damaging home mechanical systems such as heating furnaces, hot water tanks, plumbing and septic tanks. Immediate relief would require removal of water from the Pond; and

WHEREAS, the project objective is the dewatering of Jobs Pond and pipeline construction in an effort to relieve flooding; and

WHEREAS, the NRCS will provide technical and financial assistance to the Town of Portland for the project for implementation of recovery measures, that if left undone, pose a risk to life and/or property; and

WHEREAS, NRCS will pay up to 75% of the eligible construction costs and the Sponsor (the "Town") is required to contribute a 25% match; and

WHEREAS, the Town anticipates to receive a grant from the State of Connecticut Department of Energy and Environmental Protection to cover the 25% match; and

WHEREAS, the total estimated project budget is \$760,000 of which the Federal share is \$572,500 and the Non-Federal (State of CT) share is \$187,500; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Portland Town Charter, Chapter V, Section 503(i), this matter is subject to approval at a Special Town Meeting of which was held on June 18, 2024 at 7:15 PM.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the Board of Selectmen hereby authorizes Ryan J. Curley, First Selectman, to execute and file such application with the USDA/Natural Resources Conservation Service under the authority of the Emergency Watershed Protection, to execute any amendments, decision, and revisions thereto, and to act as the authorized representative of the Town of Portland; and be it further

RESOLVED the Board of Selectmen hereby authorizes Ryan J. Curley, First Selectman, to execute and file such application with the State of Connecticut Department of Energy and Environmental Protection, to execute any amendments, decision, and revisions thereto, and to act as the authorized representative of the Town of Portland.

Moderator Shaun Manning called for discussion. There were two comments:

- (1) Ryan Curley of 795 Glastonbury Turnpike spoke in favor of the resolution, stating that the town has received two grants covering 100% of this project. He further stated that there is no cost to the town, as this resolution is allowing him to sign the contract. He thanked the USDA for 75% of the funding. He also thanked Governor Ned Lamont, State Senator Norm Needleman, and State Representative Christie Carpino for their assistance getting the remaining 25% funded through the State Bonding Commission.
- (2) Jeanne Bishop of 18 Jobs Gate 1 spoke in favor of the resolution. She wanted to thank everyone who worked with them on this issue, including US Senator Richard Blumenthal who helped tremendously.

Ryan Curley called for a paper ballot vote on the Resolution, seconded by John Dillon. The vote was counted by the Moderator and the Clerk, and the result were: Yes- 48; No- 1; and 0 abstentions. The Motion carried.

A motion was made by Tim Lavoy, seconded by Michael Pelton to adjourn the meeting. The motion passed unanimously. The meeting was adjourned at 7:26 P.M.
